WHEREAS, the Bergenfield Board of Education ("Board") advertised for bids for Concrete and Masonry Services ("Services"); and

WHEREAS, on October 4, 2022, the Board received two bids for the Services; and

WHEREAS, the lowest bidder C&C Masonry, Inc. ("C&C") submitted a bid that is materially defective insofar as the bidder failed to provide a \$5,000 bid bond, cashier's check or certified check, failed to provide a certificate of surety and failed to provide a New Jersey Department of the Treasury Division of Property Management and Construction ("DPMC") "Total Amount of Uncompleted Contracts" form, all of which are non-waivable material defects; and

WHEREAS, the second lowest bidder, Crossroads Pavement Maintenance, LLC. ("Crossroads"), submitted a bid in the amounts of Journeyman-\$335.00 per hour; Foreman-\$385.00 per hour; Deputy Foreman-\$355.00 per hour; and Laborer/Apprentice-\$295.00 per hour, which is in excess of the Board's cost estimates for the Services and, as such, is not reasonable as to price; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to reject C&C's bid for being materially defective, to reject Crossroad's bid for exceeding its cost estimates for the Services, and to authorize the Business Administrator to re-advertise for bids for the Services.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The bid submitted by the lowest bidder, C&C Masonry, Inc. had non-waivable defects and is hereby rejected.
- 2. The bid submitted by Crossroads Pavement Maintenance, LLC. exceeded the Board's cost estimates and, as such, is not reasonable as to price and is hereby rejected.
