WHEREAS, the Bergenfield Board of Education (the "Board") advertised for bids for the District Wide Mechanical Upgrades Project (the "Project");

WHEREAS, on April 11, 2023, the Board received and publicly opened two bids for the Project;

WHEREAS, the lowest bidder, Environmental Climate Control ("Environmental"), submitted a bid in the amount of \$1,327,000, together with alternatives, which was defective since Environmental did not possess one of the classifications required by specifications which cannot be waived; and

WHEREAS, the next lowest bid for the Project was submitted by Centralpack Engineering Corp. ("Centralpack") with a base bid in the amount of \$1,417,500, together with Alternate #3 in the amount of \$261,200, Alternate #8 in the amount of \$40,600 and Alternate #11 in the amount of \$43,930, for a total contract amount of \$1,763,230; and

WHEREAS, the bid submitted by Centralpack is responsive in all material respects and the Board is desirous of awarding the contract for the Project to Centralpack;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board hereby rejects Environmental's bid due to a non-waivable material defect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby awards the contract for the District Wide Mechanical Upgrades Project to Centralpack Engineering Corp. in a total contract sum of \$1,763,230, including the base bid and alternates 3, 8, and 11.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this award is expressly conditioned upon the contractor furnishing the requisite insurance certificate and labor and materials/performance bond as required in the Project specifications, together with an AA201-Project Manning Report, an executed A-101-Standard Form of Agreement Between Owner and Contractor, A-201-General Conditions of the Contract for Construction, as prepared by the Board Attorney, within ten (10) days of the date hereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board Attorney is hereby directed to draft the agreement with Centralpack consistent with this Resolution and with the terms contained in the bid documents approved by the Board for the Project. The Board President and the Board Secretary are hereby authorized to execute such agreement and any other documents necessary to effectuate the terms of this Resolution.
